

Learning outcomes assessment system

Assessment of learning outcomes is carried out on a cumulative 100-point system. The minimum number of points for the current control during the semester, which allows the student to take the exam - 35, the maximum - 60. The final control is conducted in the form of a semester exam. The minimum score that allows you to successfully pass the exam - 25, the maximum - 40. The total number of points in the discipline is defined as a simple sum of points on the results of student success (maximum - 100 points).
