**Assessment forms and methods**

Assessment of the formed competencies of students is carried out according to the accumulative 100-point system.

Current control is carried out during lectures, practical (seminar) classes and is aimed at assessing the level of preparedness of the higher education applicant to perform a specific job and is evaluated by the sum of points scored.

Current control includes the following control measures: written control works; presentations, essays. The maximum possible number of points for the current control during the semester for the discipline whose form of control is the exam is 60, and the minimum possible number of points is 35. The final control is conducted in the form of an exam. The semester exam is taken during the exam session. The maximum number of points that a student of higher education can receive during the examination is 40 points. The minimum amount for which the exam is considered passed is 25 points.

The final grade for the academic discipline is determined by: adding up the points for the current and final control.
