The university uses a 100-point accumulative system for evaluating the learning outcomes of students of higher education.

Current control is carried out during lecture, practical, laboratory and seminar classes and is aimed at checking the level of preparedness of the student of higher education for the performance of specific work and is evaluated by the sum of points scored: the maximum sum is 60 points; the minimum amount that allows a student of higher education to pass an exam is 35 points. Current control includes the following assessment methods: express tests; competence oriented tasks on topics; presentation.

The final control includes the semester control and certification of the student of higher education. Semester control is conducted in the form of a semester exam (exam). The semester exam (exam) is taken during the exam session. The maximum number of points that a student of higher education can receive during the examination (examination) is 40 points. The minimum amount for which the exam is considered passed is 25 points. The final grade for the academic discipline is determined by: adding up the points for the current and final control.

Course policies

Teaching of the academic discipline is based on the principles of academic integrity. Violation of academic integrity includes academic plagiarism, fabrication, falsification, cheating, deception, bribery, and biased assessment. Educational students may be brought to the following academic responsibility for breach of academic integrity: repeated assessment of the corresponding type of learning activity.
