Assessment system of learning outcomes

The university uses a 100-point cumulative system for assessing students' learning outcomes. Continuous assessment is carried out during practical classes and aims to check students' readiness to perform specific tasks. It is evaluated based on the total points scored. The final assessment includes the semester control, which is conducted as a graded credit (differentiated assessment). The maximum possible score for the continuous assessment during the semester (for disciplines where the form of control is a credit) is 100 points, and the minimum passing score is 60 points. Continuous assessment includes the following evaluation measures: comprehensive practical assignments and tests. More detailed information on the assessment and grading system is provided in the discipline's work plan (technological card).

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Discipline policy

The course is taught in accordance with the principles of academic integrity. Violations of academic integrity include academic plagiarism, fabrication, falsification, cheating, deception, bribery, or biased evaluation. Students found in violation of academic integrity will be held academically accountable, which entails a mandatory re-evaluation of the relevant assignment or educational work.
