Assessment system of learning outcomes	
<i>The system of assessment of the competences which applicants have possessed covers lectures, practical lessons, performance of independent work. Evaluation is carried out on the basis of a cumulative 100-point system. Final / semester control of knowledge and competencies of applicants in the discipline is carried out in the form of differentiated semester test, the goal of which is to test the applicant's understanding of the program material as a whole, logic and relationships between individual sections, ability to creatively use accumulated knowledge. problems of academic discipline, etc. It should be considered the tested one if the sum of points obtained by the final / semester test of success is equal to or exceeds 60. The total result for semester is as follows: "60 and more points is pass", "59 and less is not pass".
