

Assessment system

Assessment of higher education seekers` learning outcomes is carried out by the university according to the cumulative 100-point system

Current control is carried out during lectures, practical, laboratory and seminar classes and aims to check the level of the level of readiness of the higher education student to perform a specific job and is assessed by the amount of points scored: the maximum possible number of points for the current control during the semester for the discipline in the form of credit control is 100 and the minimum possible number of points is 60.
